HOW TO CHECK FOR EMERGENCY / DANGER SIGNS

Action Protocol Based on Assessment

Assessment	Findings	Action To Be Taken
Danger Signs	 Not accepting feeds Lethargy and altered sensorium Severe chest indrawing Intractable/persistent vomiting History of convulsion in current illness 	URGENT REFERRAL to NRC/nearest Health Facility
Respiratory Rate	 ≥60 respirations/minute under two months ≥50 respirations/minute from 2-12 months ≥40 respirations/minute from 1-5 years 	Refer to NRC
Temperature	 > 39 degree Centigrade (>102.2 degree Fahrenheit) < 35 degree Centigrade (<95 degree Fahrenheit) 	Refer to NRC
(Axillary)	 Fever - Mild to moderate < 39 degree (<102.2 degree Fahrenheit) Temperature below 36.5 degree but above 35 degree (above 95 degree Fahrenheit) 	SSFP Programme
Diarrhoea	 Diarrhoea of fourteen days or more duration Dysentery Some or severe dehydration 	Refer to NRC
	► No dehydration	SSFP Programme
Cough	More than two weeks	NRC
Pallor	Severe pallor	NRC
	Some Pallor / No Pallor	SSFP Programme
Oedema	Bilateral pitting Oedema	NRC
Skin	Extensive skin lesions / denuded skin	Refer to NRC
Others	 Mother / caregiver not confident Age - less than six months Static weight for three consecutive weeks or weight loss for two consecutive weeks 	NRC
